2012/13 President's & Manager's Report

It is with much pleasure that we present the annual report for the 2012/13 season. Another year as part of the executive committee reinforces the depth of the volunteer base that assists and makes our game so successful. I would like to thank all those that put their hands up and contribute in some way. To the executive committee and Barry Hazeldine (CJCA Manager) a special thanks for your commitment and dedication over the last 12 months. To our Patron and long servicing committee member Derek Cockburn, thank you for ensuring we respect the past and your guidance into the future, The CJCA committee is losing the services of Peter Heenan and Gary Tempero who are standing down after years of outstanding service. Peter the previous past CJCA President has also had roles as Grade manager, coach and manager of various regional and representative sides. Gary, a well organised and hardworking Grade Manager for the last three years. CJCA would like to acknowledge the passing of a number of long serving supporters and servants of Christchurch junior cricket during the past year. Our sympathies and condolences are extended to the families of Sam Guillen, Ray Ganda, Mike Shardlow, Neville Slaughter, Tony Farrant, Norman Biddick, Vince Orange and Gary Ashworth.

Even with increased investment in pre-season promotional work using a number of different marketing channels there was a decrease of 19 teams from the 11/12 season to 223 teams starting this season. Whilst we do not know all the reasons for this drop we believe like all sports we are still suffering the effects of the earthquakes with displaced families and less occupied homes in some areas. The pre-season promotional activities have certainly assisted the clubs in retaining and attracting new members and this will again be a key focus at the start of next season. Even with this decrease there are still approximately 2,500 boys and girls playing competitive cricket, with at least another 3-400 boys and girls playing Kiwi or Have a Go cricket. Clearly junior cricket remains an important summer sport in Christchurch. The Saturday competitions, regional tournaments and representative games continue to run smoothly which is due to the hard work and dedication of the CJCA Manager and Grade managers. Many thanks to the Grade Managers, Alan Hickford, Francis van Woerkom, Gary Tempero, Brent Libeau, Kieran James, Barry Hazeldine and Peter Hay. For the girl's competition and regional tournaments we are very fortunate to have a progressive and passionate team leading the way in Ady Simmons, Chris Holt, Brent Davidson and Paul Gray.

CJCA continues to have a close working relationship with CCA and the relatively new entity Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Association (Metro) as they both provide important services to Christchurch junior cricket. Metro representation at CJCA executive meetings assists with ensuring a more consistent approach between the organisations, improved transition for players from junior to youth, opportunities for combined initiatives in respect to promotional work, coaching programmes and investment in pitches. Metro through Mike Fisher does all the draws and ground allocation for junior teams at times, a thankless task but a critical function for the smooth running of competitive cricket.

Providing good quality playing surfaces and pitches is challenging. We are reliant on schools, clubs and the council as they are the key players in ensuring this happens. Through Mike Fisher the council has been very responsive when we are made aware of issues with grounds under their control and we understand the financial pressures within the clubs and schools which can make it difficult to maintain grounds to the level they and we would like. We are fortunate to have the services of Danny Timpson who continues to prepare the outfield wickets for the soft ball grades. CJCA continues its programme of investing in artificial pitches within schools or on council grounds. This year we have installed pitches at Sheldon Park, Somerfield School and Heathcote Valley School. In the near future another pitch is being installed at Shirley Intermediate.

Hosting of both the girls and boys South Island Primary Schools tournaments (SIPST) was a real highlight of the year. The girl's tournament was the inaugural competition and was born due to the vision and drive of Ady Simmons, Brent Davidson, Chris Holt and Paul Gray. Six teams enjoyed a wonderful week of cricket at Christchurch Boys High with the Christchurch girls Blue side being the first winner. Planning is already underway for next year's tournament which will again be hosted in Christchurch. The boys 50th SIPST was an outstanding week of cricket enjoyed by all who were involved. A huge gratitude of thanks must go to the

organising committee of Barry Hazeldine, Brent McConchie, Gary Tempero, Paul Dolan, Derek Cockburn, Peter Burke and Ben Harris. From the opening ceremony where teams had time with either Stephen Fleming, Blair Hartland, Leon McDonald or Stephen Boock to the final day with the Christchurch Red side winning the Sir Jack Newman Trophy it will be remembered as a great week show casing junior cricket. Special mention must be made of Derek Cockburn who has attended all 50 tournaments and is a historian of this tournament. Thanks also to Media Works (Ben Harris), E2 (Mike Dunlop), Hewlett Packard, Cricket Express, Kookaburra CricHQ and Christchurch City Council for their assistance. Many thanks also to Danny Timpson at Hospital Corner, Paul O'Connor at Christ's College and Dave Miles at Elmwood Park for their work on the pitches and outfield. The Mandeville tournament hosted by Canterbury Country for year 6 and 7 teams remains a highlight for the CJCA development teams. Rain severely interrupted the year 6 tournament with only 2 days play possible however the weather settled the following week with the Hadlee Development side winning the Yr. 7 tournament unbeaten.

The awards night was expanded this year to recognise success at representative level and acknowledge the winners of the year 7 & 8 Premier grades. The Jubilee batting and bowling awards have been made to the year 6, 7 or 8 boy and girl players who score the most runs or take the most wickets at regional tournament games and at Mandeville or SIPST. For the 2012 calendar year these were awarded to Sophie Germon (Batting & Bowling), Jayden Ball (Batting) and Jono Raymond (Bowling).

The winter training programmes continues to be well received with the feedback from the survey conducted enabling improvements to be made for the upcoming programme. In conjunction with this training year 8 boys will be offered umpiring training to prepare them as they move into youth cricket. Coaching sessions were also organised for the regional coaches and a coaching day for teachers was run by Canterbury Cricket.

The CJCA remains financially sound with a \$20,949 surplus (post GST effects of previous year) over the last financial year. This excess (of which approximately \$10,000 is from interest received from deposits and other funds on hand) is helping to maintain and slightly improve the overall financial position of the CJCA with total accumulated funds of \$313,095. Thanks to Libby Hickford for her work as Treasurer and implementing the Zero accounting package we now have in use. Grants and sponsorship remain significant income sources for the association. CJCA would like to acknowledge the support and funding from Canterbury Community Trust (\$40,000), NZCT (\$25,000), Southern Trust (\$5,000) and the Lion Foundation (\$4,000) and our major sponsor Cricket Express. Cricket Express support has enabled us to continue to provide sun safe cricket hats to new players, badges to all playing in the spring and Summer Tournaments and other tournament related equipment. They voluntarily increased their sponsorship to the value of \$7,683 per season from the 2012/13 season. The CJCA strategic plan has been reviewed this year which clearly sets the direction for the association over the next 3 years. The CJCA remains in a strong position to promote and advance junior cricket in Christchurch.
