2013/14 President's & Manager's Report

It is with much pleasure that we present the annual report for the 2013/14 season. Overall it has been another good year for junior cricket, thanks again to the dedication and commitment of our volunteer base. Demands on time are ever increasing so a sincere thanks to all that support our game. To the executive committee and Barry Hazeldine (CJCA Manager) once again thanks for your efforts and continued commitment to junior cricket. The CJCA committee is losing the services of Ady Simmons, Brent Davidson, and Chris Holt who along with Paul Gray (girls' grade manager) have been instrumental in driving and increasing the profile of girls' cricket, not only in Christchurch but the whole of the South Island. This group of gentleman had a goal of starting the girls' equivalent of the boys South Island Primary Schools Tournament and completed the second such tournament this year which was another resounding success. We are fortunate they are prepared to be involved in the running of next year's tournament to ensure this gets embedded into the cricketing calendar.

CJCA would like to acknowledge the passing of a number of long serving supporters and servants of Christchurch junior cricket during the past year. Our sympathies and condolences are extended to the families of Tony Timpson, Eric Harrington, Dorothy Penfold, Stephen Goodliffe, Fred Shaw and David Ballisat.

At last year's AGM the refreshed strategic plan for CJCA was presented. Performance (based on player/parent survey) to the strategic plan is summarised in the table below for the key parameters;

Overall the results are pleasing and indicate that the majority of what the CJCA has in place is working well. Players have indicated they are having fun, we have promoted and financially supported recognised coaching courses and where opportunities exist continue to invest in artificial wickets. However a major challenge for the executive and clubs is that player numbers continue to trend down even with more focus on pre-season promotional activities. As a start to addressing this issue CJCA organised a recruitment and retention forum for clubs using the knowledge and experience of Alec Astle as the facilitator. Whilst there is no magic bullet there are strategies that tend to be more successful. The executive is now reviewing how it can assist clubs with some of these strategies as we appreciate any initiative takes time. We are also looking at how we can leverage off the upcoming Cricket World Cup, knowing that history shows that there is normally a spike in player numbers at these times.

The Saturday competitions, regional tournaments and representative games continue to run smoothly which is due to the hard work and dedication of the CJCA Manager, Grade managers, team coaches and managers. Our thanks are again extended to Danny Timpson and his new partner, Tom O'Carroll, who prepare the outfield pitches for the softball grades. Danny also goes the extra mile in preparing the wickets at Hospital Corner for the tournaments and Rep games. The Canterbury Country Mandeville tournament remains a highlight in the calendar for the year 6 & 7 Development teams. The boys 51st SIPST was held in Gore with the weather having a major impact with two days lost to rain and the final day played in very unpleasant showery conditions. This made the competition a bit of a lottery with the unbeaten Red team coming third one point behind the eventual winners and the Black team a further point back. Even with the rain it was an enjoyable week for all the boys and their supporters. The second girls SIPST was held again in Christchurch under sunny skies with six teams competing with Cornwall CC, from Auckland, the winners.

CJCA and Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Association (Metro) are responsible for amateur cricket in Christchurch and work closely in a number of joint areas such as coaching programmes, preseason promotions; the investment in artificial pitches and the transition of players from junior to youth. Metro provides the competition draws and ground allocations for all the junior teams. As resources become tighter and both organisations look for greater efficiencies there may be opportunities to further develop this relationship.

The awards night is held in conjunction with Metro and recognises the success at representative level and acknowledge the winners of the year 7 & 8 Premier grades. The Jubilee batting and bowling awards have been made to the year 6, 7 or 8 boy and girl players who score the most runs or take the most wickets at regional tournament games and at Mandeville or SIPST. For the 2013 calendar year these were awarded to Kirran Maynard (batting) and Aimee Brown (bowling) for the girls and Zak Foulkes (batting & bowling) for the boys.

The CJCA remains financially sound with a \$14,965 surplus for this financial year and accumulated funds of \$3238,060629. The Xero accounting package is working well and provides excellent reporting on CJCA's financial position – thanks again to Libby Hickford for her work in this area. Grants and sponsorship remain significant income sources for the association but they are proving hard to come by so care is needed to safeguard our funds for the future. CJCA would like to acknowledge the support and funding from Canterbury Community Trust (\$30,000), CERT (\$11,268) and Kookaburra (\$500) and our major sponsor Cricket Express.

CJCA is well positioned to face the challenges in the 2014/15 season.
